

Background

It's now nearly fifty years since Harvey Cox's groundbreaking book, *The Secular City* (1965) described the changing urban context for the church's mission and ministry. Humankind come of age. The postsecular city is now an unanticipated and pluralist setting for the church's ministry. In their introduction to "Postsecular Cities" (2011) the co-editors describe seven areas of debate in the shift from the secular to post secular context. Author and guest speaker at the conference, Dr Chris Baker, will invite participants to explore the implications this has for mainline churches today.

On the day following the conference, Friday September 27th Chris Baker will be guest of the South Australian Council of Churches and Pilgrim Church for a half day round table between church leaders and social planners from State and local governments in SA.

Dr Chris Baker is Director of Research for the William Temple Foundation, Director of the Centre for Faiths and Public Policy and Senior Lecturer in Urban and Public Theology at the University of Chester.

He is a leading researcher and published author in the field of religion and public life with a focus on the hybrid nature of urban communities and the role of religion in public policy and social welfare. Chris has contributed to the debate about the place of religious traditions in civil society and how churches are redefining their place in the urban environment. To this end he is a leading theorist and exponent on ideas relating to the postsecular nature of the city, the place of religion and spiritual capital. His work is based on the UK experience but is also informing debates within Europe, the US and Australia.

His published works include *Postsecular Cities: Space Theory and Practice* (Continuum 2011) edited with Justin Beaumont, *Christianity and the New Social Order* (SCM 2011) *The Hybrid Church in the City-Third Space Thinking* (Ashgate 2007).

The conference program will begin with a welcome at 10.00am on Tuesday 24th and conclude at 4.00pm on Thursday 26th.

THE PROGRAM WILL BE IN TWO PARTS

Morning sessions will explore the big picture; including the changing character of postsecular urban locations and the implications this has for the church's ministry. These sessions will include discussion about the hybrid and pluralist nature of urban places and how congregations are responding to this changing context through their mission practices and theological insights.

Afternoon sessions, the practicum, will draw on insights from effective community development practices. CDPs are an important medium for congregations as they engage and form partnerships with their host communities.
